PROGRAMME

1. Welcome

The Supernova Class Association and Rutland Sailing Club invite Supernova sailors and their partners and friends to race training and the 2008 Supernova Inland Championships.

It will comprise:

Friday 29 August: race training from noon.
Saturday 30 to Sunday 31 August: Inland Championships.

Lightnings, Streakers and Laser Masters are also holding events over the weekend. There will be two courses.

2. Training

The fee for race training will be £5, paid on the day. It would help planning if you could register your interest with Chris Bower at bowerpower@btinternet.com by Thursday 21 August 2008. This is not essential.

The training will be led by Mike Gibson (2008 National Champion) and Richard Pakes (2007 Travelers Trophy winner). Please have your boat ready (sail down) and report to the training room dressed for sailing, at noon on Friday 29 August. The training will be quite practical and probably in two sessions, with a half time break at say about 2.30 pm and then a second session finishing about 4.30 pm.

3. Social Programme

Friday 29 August	Snacks available all day and evening meal available 6.30 – 8.30 pm. Bar open for the evening.
Saturday 30 August	Snacks available all day and evening meal available 6.30 – 8.30 pm. Approx. 17:30 h AGM in Training Room (depending on racing). Bar open for the evening.
Sunday 31 August	Snacks available all day. Prize Giving after racing

4. Club facilities

Rutland Water is one of the largest man-made stretches of water in Europe, as big as Windermere and set in some of Britain's loveliest countryside. It has over 3000 acres (1215 hectares) of sheltered water. The Club has three permanent racing areas laid out on the water, allowing racing to take place in practically any conditions, while still leaving plenty of room for leisure sailing.

The 10,000 square foot (929 sq m) Clubhouse provides first rate changing facilities, with showers. The Wet Bar caters for the sailor's needs through the day and there's a luxurious lounge, lecture rooms and viewing deck. In addition, there is a bar and catering facilities.

The thirteen acre site has seven concrete slipways with four pontoons and connecting walkways. There is parking space for 850 dinghies and sailboards.

Purple Marine provides an on-site Chandlers, open at weekends.

Dogs are not allowed on site, either in cars or on a lead.

Please note that the office is closed on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

5. Directions

Rutland Sailing Club is based on the South shore of Rutland Water, Rutland. The club web site has a handy map. Follow road signs for 'South Shore' then 'Sailing Club'.

6. Accommodation

The club has 48 beds in 10 simply furnished bunk rooms, some with ensuite facilities, which can be booked by visiting sailors. Rates: £13.00 pppn with shower and £11.00 pppn without shower. These can be booked through the Office on 01780 720292 or by emailing: sailing@rutlandsc.co.uk.

7. Local attractions

Stamford, Oakham and Uppingham are all about 7 miles away. They have lots of shops, including antiques. Stamford is 'Britain's finest Georgian town', with tea rooms and award winning pubs. Middlemarch and Pride & Prejudice were filmed there. Burghley House is a stately home with Sculpture Garden and Garden of Surprises. Other attractions include Barnsdale Gardens (the late Geoff Hamilton's place), the Lands End factory shop and a Butterfly Centre. Fit folk may wish to hire a bike and cycle around the reservoir (27 or 17 miles).
