### NOTICE OF RACE

Entries are invited from competitors for the **Noble Marine Supernova Southern Traveller Series Open Meeting 2026** organised by **HAVERSHAM SAILING CLUB** at Haversham Lake, Milton Keynes on **Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2026**.

#### 1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by The World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing 2025 - 2028, the Prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association, Supernova Class Rules and Haversham Sailing Club's Sailing Instructions. Racing Rules 27.1 and 40 will be changed to the effect that buoyancy aids are required. The changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions. Competitors should note that Haversham Sailing Club implement the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book.

#### 2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

The regatta is open to all boats of the Supernova class. All Traveller Series competitors must be members of the Supernova Class Association. All boats must comply with the Supernova class rules as amended by the class association. Eligible boats may enter by completing the event entry form, which will be available on the HSC [website](#) under 'Latest News' on the home page. The entry form will also be available on the morning of the event from 0930.

#### 3 ENTRY FEE

The entry fee of £20, which will include breakfast bacon bap and hot drinks throughout the day, should be paid to the Haversham Sailing Club Ltd, full details on the entry form.

#### 4 SCHEDULE

Registration will take place in the clubhouse from 0930 to 1030.

A competitors' briefing will be held in front of the club balcony at 1030.

Three races are scheduled for the event. One race is required to be completed to constitute an event. There will be one discard if three races have been completed and no discards if less than three races are completed.

1<sup>st</sup> Race start 11.00hrs. 2<sup>nd</sup> Race start 1300hrs. 3<sup>rd</sup> Race to start back-to-back with 2<sup>nd</sup> race, or as decided by the Race Officer.

The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1055. The target time for each race is 50 minutes.

#### 5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Event Supplementary Sailing Instructions will be available at time of entry on the club website.

#### 6 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> - 3<sup>rd</sup> places overall. Other prizes may also be awarded depending on the size of the entry.

#### 7 RISK STATEMENT

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- They are responsible for the safety of themselves/crew/boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;

- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

### 8 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of at least £3,000,000 or the equivalent.

### 10 FOOD AND ACCOMMODATION

Food and hot drinks will be available at lunchtime and also from 0800 for the early arrivals. Camping on site is available the night before the event and can be booked on the entry form.

### 11 DOGS

Dogs are allowed on site but are not permitted in the clubhouse or on the balcony. Dogs must be under control at all times and kept on a lead within the car park, dinghy compound and camping field.

### 12 NON-NATIVE SPECIES

In order to restrict the ingress of non-native invasive species to our water, the principle of **Check Clean Dry** shall apply to boats being brought to the club. No boat shall enter the club premises with the intention of launching onto the water without being checked, cleaned and fully dried (for a minimum of two days) before arriving.
