Full co-operation is the only way that we can ensure that open meetings are run safely and meet government guidance. All trolleys must be clearly marked with the sail number and when supplied the launch flight colour.

Increased likelihood of further transmission of infection	Essential safety cover is defined as when a sailor is unable to retrieve a boat safely themselves and life is at risk. No equipment will be rescued until conditions allow for it to be safe to do so by the safety team. All those on site must do what the safety team instructs at all times for their and the safety teams own safety. Anyone taking to the water must only do so in conditions that are within there own capabilities to sail in and must be confident of their own ablility to self rescue in the event of a capsize. All craft and equipment should be in good condition at the time of launching. Failure of equipment not only puts yourself unnecessarily at risk but

				others too! In the event of a rescue. You should do exactly as instructed by the safety crew.
First aid	Administered as necessary	Spreading of Covid- 19 through high contact areas and being in close proximity to others	Increased likelihood of further transmission of infection	A reasonable, practicable approach will be undertaken when administering first aid as this is likely to contradict distancing requirements currently in force. As an example, it would be deemed acceptable for an injured person to self apply plasters and wash small cuts and wounds. Where more serious injuries will be made catastrophically worse by not receiving first aid however, this must be deemed a more significant effect and first aiders should discharge their duties accordingly
